## **RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION**

## 1. RULES: This show is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Federation Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

2. SHOW MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit of entries and to cancel award prizes without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute official. The judges decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions.

- 3. ENTRY PROCEDURES
  - ENTRIES CLOSE ON Monday, June 5th. Entries postmarked later will be assessed a \$25.00 late fee. Correct fees and association numbers MUST ACCOMPANY EACH EN-TRY FORM or an INCOMPLETE ENTRY FEE OF \$25.00 will be charged, no exceptions! Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and association numbers.
  - OFFICE FEE. \$46.00 on-line / \$56.00 with paper entry.
  - NLY per entry form.

  - Veterinarian/Doctors Certificate only. Office Fee will be retained.
  - IECKS: A fee of \$25.00 will be charged for all returned checks. Accounts days to be paid in full with cash or equivalent or they will be turned over to USEF for further disciplinary action.
  - SCRATCHES: Scratches made prior to the closing date will receive a complete refund. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to inform the management, (of their intention to scratch. No -shows will be billed for all unpaid entry fees.

POST ENTRIES: Post entries will be accepted to fill scratches if the schedule permits.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their OWn National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

## **RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued**

NON-MEMBER FEES: USEF non-member Show Pass fee is \$45.00. USDF non-member fee is \$35.00. These fees apply per show.
 HID FEES: USDF HID fee is \$35.00. You MUST upgrade to a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration and a USEF Annual or Lifetime Horse Recording to participate in Great

American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships qualifying classes.

- 6. CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management and property owners will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its Directors and Employees, Property Owners, and Employees harmless for any loss or accident to himself, his horse, horses or equip ment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- 7. MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold SLO-CDS and the property owners harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless a parent or guardian signs it. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.
- 8. RIDING TIMES: Riding times will be e-mailed to all exhibitors on the Wednesday before the show and will be posted at www.slocds.org & www.foxvillage.com. It is the rider's response bility to inform the management of any time conflicts at least 72 hours prior to the sched-uled rides. Exceeding 45 seconds before entering the arena after the bell has sounded will entail elimination.
- 9. COMPETITION ARENAS: Sand/GGTfooting, 20 x 60 meters.
- 10 CLOSED ARENAS: Horses are not permitted in competition arenas on a show day at any time other than scheduled riding times. Violation will be cause for elimination.
- 11. LUNGEING: No lunging in the warm-up arenas during competition. A lunging area will be provided.
- 12 . TESTS: Current USEF and FEI tests will be used. Current FEI and USDF Musi cal Freestyles are offered.

SCORED TESTS: Tests will be given ONLY TO RIDERS or their agents and only after the class is placed. Check all scores upon receipt of test.

- 13. 2021 GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS: In order to qualify for a Regional Championship, horse/rider combinations may qualify by earning a minimum of 2 qualifying scores at two official GAIG/USDF recognized competitions from two different judges in any region. Riders may now ride in qualifying classes both days.
- AWARDS: Ribbons through 5<sup>th</sup> place. First place awards to classes with 3 or more entries. Hi-point awards to junior, open and adult amateur riders both days. CLASSES 500, 501, 502, 600, 601, 602: MUST ENTER AND COMPLETE ANY DRESSAGE TEST, INTRO INCLUDED.
- 15. GROUNDS: Exhibitors may park cars, trucks, and trailers in designated areas only. <u>DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH OR OTHERWISE CONTAINED.</u> Persons on foot are not allowed in the warm-up areas. Lungeing is only allowed in designat-

ed areas.

- 16 DAY USE FEE of \$40.00 per horse per day for parking/tying is to be added to entry fee. PLUS Haul-in fee, CDFA Drug fee, and a signed release.
- 17. STABLING: permanet 12 x 12 stalls with top doors will be available at a cost of \$140.00 per stall or tack room for the duration of the show. Daily stall rental is \$80.00 with no overnight. Shavings—\$13/bale.
- CAMPING: RV Site available at \$85.00/night, water & poewer hookups. Water only is \$50.00/ night.
- 19. FOOD: Available on grounds
- 20. EMT ON SITE. Veterinarian and farrier on call. Numbers posted in the office
- 21. PROTESTS: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$200.00 with the secretary of the show, which sum will be forfeited to the Horse Show if not sustained. All protests must be filed in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the Show Secretary within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation.
- 22. CANCELLATION: In the event of rain prior to the show, it is the responsibility of the rider to call the Management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are NOT canceled unless the footing is deemed unsafe. If the show is canceled for any reason, an office

- 23. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who Signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 24. \*\* OPPORTUNITY CLASSES \$50 per test. Horse, rider, owner, trainer do not have to be USEF, USDF, CDS members and do not have to pay non-member fees or USEF Drug fees, or CDS Travel Grant Fee. Office fee, CDFA Drug fee and Grounds/Stabling fees do apply. Horses may not be entered in the same test on the same day! I.E. Class 195 and class 101. You may enter an Opportunity Classe and ANOTHER class on the same day! I.E. Class 195 and class 102. Opportunity Classes are not eligible for USEF/USDF End of Year Awards Programs. Opportunity Classes <u>DO COUNT</u> toward CDS Qualifying, CDS End of Year Awards, CDS RAAC Qualifying, and JR Championships, as long as CDS membership is cur rent when scores are earned. Classes may not necessarily run in this order. You must be ready to ride any class entered at any time.
- 25. In regards to class 191 and 291, Para-Equestrian Test of Choice, please be aware that beginning in the 2016 competition year, which began on October 1st, 2015, participants and horses competing in Para-Equestrian classes at USDF recognized competitions will no longer be exempt from USDF memberships. Para-Equestrian competitors will now be required to have a USDF Group Membership, a USDF Participating Membership or a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$35 Non-Member fee per competition. Owners of horses competing in the Para-Equestrian classes will be required to have a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$35 Non-Member fee per competition. Owners of horses competing in the Para-Equestrian classes will be required to have a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$35 Non-Member fee per competition. The horses competing in Para-Equestrian classes will be required to have a USDF Lifetime registered.
- 26. USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program: Please note that classes 149 and 249 Dressage Equitation can be used as a qualifying opportunity for the new USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program. Adult amateurs may qualify to compete in the regional final class held at each regional championship competition by earning one score of 70% or higher, in any dressage seat equitation class or by qualifying for the regional championship at any level, except freestyles. There is no qualifying fee, or special requirements for submitting results to USDF. For more information about the USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program, please visit the USDF website, www.usdf.org.
- 27. At all times while mounted, riders must wear a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM/ SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.
- 28. SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. ## **COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND PRACTICES**

For this show, we will be observing the following practices and expect competitors to comply with all signage and published information. Updates and additions per state, local and Federation guidelines may be added at any time and will be distributed electronically to all competitors. It is your responsibility to disseminate the information to everyone in your group.

- **Temperatures:** Everyone on the grounds is required to self-monitor their temperature. 101.5 F (37.5 C) or below. DO NOT COME TO THE SHOW GROUNDS IF YOUR TEMPERATURE IS ABOVE 100.4 F (37.5C)
- **Entering the showgrounds:** Everyone is required to immediately check-in at the Temperature Check-in Station before entering the show grounds, each day. A new wrist band will be supplied each day which must be worn while on the show grounds. Each rider will be able to bring a groom, a trainer, and one family member, NO SPECTATORS WILL BE ALLOWED. Everyone will be required to sign the WAIVER & RELEASE OF LIABILITY FORM (it is best to do this and email back before the show).
- **Unloading and Loading:** After temperature check-in horse trailers will be directed to their stabling parking or day haul-in area. Maintaining social distancing always.
- **Face Masks:** Face coverings are required to be worn, always, when not mounted, and everyone is expected to bring their own, but they will be available on the show grounds. A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing.
- **Social Distancing**: A minimum, of six feet is the separation required. Groups who travel together may work out their own distancing, but face masks must be still be worn.

Hand Washing: Must be done often in addition to the use of sanitizers.

- **Show Office:** We plan to conduct as much office business as possible by text, email, and phone ONLY. Access to the show office will be very limited. If a problem is deemed to be too complicated, the show manager will make office appointment arrangements with you. So-cial distancing protocol will be strictly adhered to. Packet distribution information will be emailed with times.
- Warm-up: A warm-up attendant will be available to supervise warm-up areas beginning Friday after 12:00 noon. You are responsible to register your warm-up time with the attendant. The attendant will keep a schedule of horses and times they are planning to use the arena(s). On show days, do not expect to enter any warm-up arena more than one hour prior to your designated time. Any equipment, attire, grooming, training items left unattended in any "common" area within the showgrounds will be removed.
- Limited Attendance: Only trainers, coaches, riders, and grooms will be allowed on the grounds. If a rider is a minor, a parent will also be allowed. Everyone must be recorded with the office, and must sign releases and wear a wrist band and face mask at all times. <u>No exceptions!</u> RELEASES WILL BE SENT OUT TO RIDERS BEFORE THE SHOW. MAKE SURE YOUR ADDITIONAL SUPPORT STAFF HAVE SIGNED A RELEASE. RELEASES MUST BE TURNED INTO THE SHOW OFFICE AT CHECK-IN OR EMAILD TO ELLEN COROB (Show Manager) PRIOR TO THE SHOW.

Hospitality: At this time, only bottled water will be available outside the show office.

Spectators: No spectators will be allowed. (See Limited Attendance and Hospitality above)

Awards: We are planning to distribute tests and awards outside the show office. Competitors are to observe social distancing when picking up ribbons and/or prizes. Classes, times and results will be on <u>www.foxvillage.com</u>, and updated as scores are imputed. It is HIGHLY recommended that exhibitors access their scores electronically if possible. Scores will be posted but again, competitors are to observe social distancing when viewing.

## **Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program**

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

## **Qualifying Requirements**

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
  - 1
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

## Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult
  amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

## **Regional Adult Amateur Competition**

MISSION: The mission of these competitions is to provide an opportunity for all CDS Adult Amateur riders to qualify and compete against others of similar skills and experience. The regional nature of these shows will help to provide our membership with a developmental path for gaining competitive experience, promote excellence and increase awareness of and support for the Chapters. Goals:

#1 – For the Chapters: These regional or "mid" level adult amateur competitions are designed to promote and enhance awareness and participation by the CDS Chapters, provide State level support in funding and advertisement, and a chance to generate funds at the chapter level.

#2 - For the Riders: These competitions will provide a positive "introductory" show experience for some, which will hopefully be a stepping stone to bigger things, while offering the other more experienced amateur riders a warm-up for the Championship Show.

#3 – For the Whole Organization: These competitions are designed to bridge the gap between the local chapter shows with individual year end awards programs and the tremendously difficult, top caliber competition at the Annual CDS Championship Show.

LOCATIONS: Three Regional CDS Chapter Adult Amateur Competitions will be held each year, one in each of the regions as defined in the CDS bylaws; north, central and south. The CENTRAL COMPETITION will be:

## • • ELIGIBILITY:

- Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 year of age or older.
- • The horse owner must be a current member of CDS.
- • Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- To be eligible to compete, the <u>\$25 registration fee</u> for each horse and rider team per level MUST BE PAID to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than 12 days prior to the first day of competition at the regional show entered.
- • Scores earned before paying the fee will count provided the payment is received at the Central Office prior to close of business as specified above.
- 2021 Qualifying Opens: August 31, 2021 at any show with CDS recognition.
- 2021 Qualifying Closes: 12 days prior to the first competition day of the regional show entered.
- Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will NOT count towards qualification.
- Horse/rider teams who qualify MAY compete in ONLY ONE regional competition

Qualification scores must be earned at CDS recognized shows and are as follows, scores can be earned at any test of the level:

- 2 scores from 1 judge at Introductory C of 65% or higher, USDF Intro C only, Novice only
- 2 scores from 1 judge at Training Level of 60% or higher, any test
- 2 scores from 1 judge at 1st level of 60% or higher, any test
- 2 scores from 1 judge at 2nd level of 60% or higher, any test
- 2 scores from 1 judge at 3rd level of 60% or higher, any test
- 2 scores from 1 judge at 4th level of 60% or higher, any test
- 2 scores from 1 judge at PSG of 60% or higher
- 2 scores from 1 judge at Intermediare 1 of 60% or higher
- Elite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training, and 1st Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at that level.
- **ROSES Award** neck ribbons will be awarded in three divisions for the High Percentage Elite and Novice Rider 50 years of age and older who officially sign-up for the division prior to their RAAC ride. Divisions: Basic through First; Second through Fourth; and FEI.

Instead, the emphasis is used a cooperative of provide the rider. Major competitions are excetully monitored to assure the providence of unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Afridavit Form and pay the \$5 afridavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Afridavis annot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

## Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
  identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

## Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21\* birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all AdequarMUSDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMS satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM ownerlessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report ising all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM acrd can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horae Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>4</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed. Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan<sup>4</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An left does not need to be renewed.

Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

## Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

 a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

## Membership Requirements

or

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

## DRESSAGE CHAPTER SPONSORSHIP

## What is "Dressage?"

Dressage is a French word that when translated, literally means "training," and derives its roots from Ancient Greece. It is a system for training horses and riders alike, to use the natural gaits of the horse – the walk, trot and canter – and the natural aids of the rider – the hands, legs, core and seat – to guide and control the horse. Dressage builds flexibility, obedience and gymnastic ability for both the horse and rider.

All of dressage is built on basics. Each level and each test within the level places more difficult and complex demands on the horse, but always within the framework of the basic gaits and in movements natural to the horse when at liberty.

The rider communicates his desire to the horse through the use of "aids." The rider will use the seat, legs, core, arms, back and body weight along with a clear cue to the horse to achieve the desired outcome. The more accomplished the rider is, the more the rider can communicate with the horse in complete rhythm and harmony to the point that the aids used almost become invisible.

## Who is "SLO-CDS?"

The San Luis Obispo Chapter of the California Dressage Society began in 1976 with about 15 charter members, several of whom are still members today. At present, our chapter has over 130 members. The California Dressage Society was founded in 1967 with only 20 members and today claims over 6,000 in 36 chapters around the state. The local chapter typically hosts several shows and educational forums each year. Our chapter meetings are held every other month and alternate between the north part of the chapter and the south. Each show involves the donated time of dozens of volunteers who work in various capacities to keep the shows moving. Many of these volunteers are local area horse people who just enjoy watching the horses working these intricate patterns.
